



# MISSOURI REAL TIME LABOR MARKET SUMMARY

July 2018 ■ Kansas City Labor Market Region



## A summary of real time labor market analysis for the past 90 days in the Kansas City Labor Market Region indicates:

- The total number of new job postings totaled 35,472 for the Kansas City LMR.
- The industry with the most job postings was Hospitals, including employers such as Hospital Corporation of America, St. Luke's Health System, Truman Medical Centers, and Children's Mercy Hospital.
- The top three occupations with the highest number of job postings were Wholesale Sales Representatives, Registered Nurses, and Retail Salespersons.
- Over two-thirds (68%) of the job postings were permanent full-time positions.

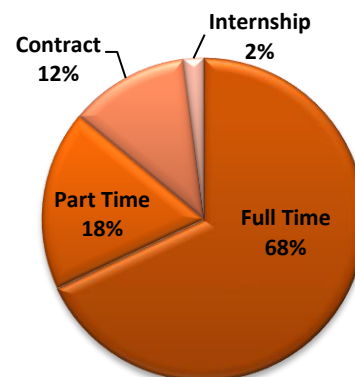

### Other Managers

This **LATER** occupation represents diverse managerial occupations that do not fit into another occupation in the management family. This can include employers who manage special programs, oversee interdisciplinary teams, and control product quality.

There were 612 new job postings for Other Managers in the past 90 days.

#### Preferred Skills:

Project Management, Budgeting, Scheduling, Customer Service, Staff Management, Project Planning and Development Skills

#### Preferred Certifications:

Project Management Certification, Driver's License, LEED AP

#### Top Employers:

**Average Annual Wage:** \$94,290

Occupations are typically classified as **NOW**, **NEXT** and **LATER**, depending on the training required.

**NOW** occupations usually require less than 1 month (short-term) to no more than 12 months (moderate-term) of on-the-job training.

**NEXT** occupations usually require more than 1 year (long-term) on-the-job training and can additionally need specific work experience; generally requires an associate's degree or a substantial vocational education.

**LATER** occupations usually require a bachelor's degree and may need specific work experience; potentially some work experience or advanced degree required.

Data for this analysis has been extracted using Burning Glass Technologies, Labor/Insight™ tool that collects information from over 35,000 web sources, including job boards, newspapers, large and small employer websites. Missouri Economic Research and Information Center (MERIC) uses this data to compile and publish reports for the State and Labor Market Regions.
